208-145 million years ago

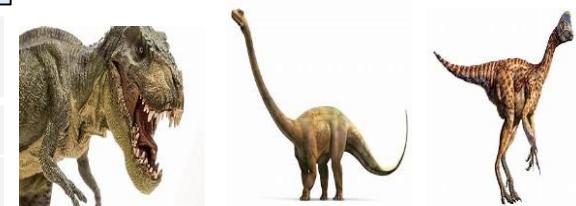


Cretaceous Period
145-65 million years ago

At the end of this period, dinosaurs became extinct.



Mesozoic Era	The period of time dinosaurs lived.
Extinct	No longer alive.
Herbivore	A plant eater.
Carnivore	A meat eater.
Omnivore	A creature that eats both meat and plants.
Pangea	A super-continent. One piece of land, not split by water.
Pre-historic	When life first appeared on Earth.
Remains	Parts that have been left behind.
Fossil	The remains of a living thing.
Observe	To watch or look at something carefully to learn from it.
Examine	To observe something closely to find information.



1908 – 1909 AD Ship builders begin to build Titanic in Ireland.	
April 19th 1912 AD The Titanic leaves Southampton on her maiden voyage.	
April 14th 1912 AD 11.40pm The Titanic hits an iceberg.	
April 15th 1912 AD 12.25am - First lifeboats are loaded with women and children.	
April 15th 1912 AD 2.05am - The last lifeboat is lowered into the water.	
April 15th 1912 AD 2.20am The Titanic begins to sink.	
September 1st 1985 AD Divers find Titanic on the bottom of the ocean floor.




