Key Learning this term...

We are so proud of our children's continued commitment to their Year 6 studies and during the first couple of weeks we will be revisiting all key maths, grammar and reading knowledge to ensure that our children are best prepared for their end of year assessments. Throughout our literacy sessions, we will be writing our own autobiography.

During the term, we will explore angles in shapes and statistics during our maths sessions. Towards the end of the term we will be investigating mathematical problems where the children will get to explore all of our mathematical topics in more depth to develop their explanation and reasoning skills.

We are excited to explore David Hockney in art. The children will be creating pictures of the Matlock landscape which are influenced by Hockney's work. In science this term, we will be looking at evolution and inheritance - the children will have chance to analyse fossils and decide how plants and animals adapt to suit their environment. In history we will investigate the Mayan civilisation through historical enquiry-based tasks.

We are most looking forward to our end of Year 6 production. We will be kick-starting rehearsals at the end of this term and we can't wait to introduce this to children- casting parts in preparation for our final term together!
