



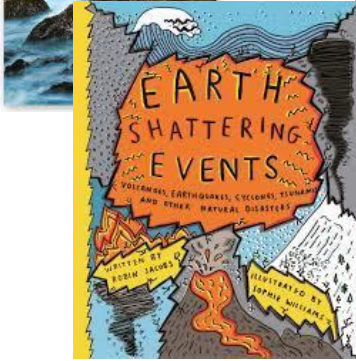
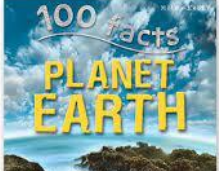
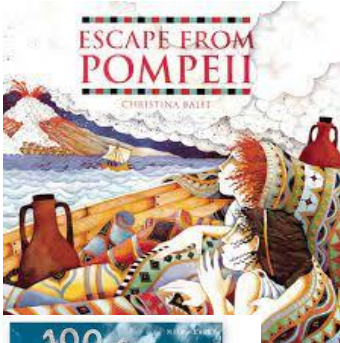

Key Learning this term...

We have now reached the final term of the school year - the year seems to have flown by! In English, we will be using our class books to explore the structure and presentation of non fiction texts. We will be writing: non-chronological reports, poetry, instructions, letters and narrative using appropriate spelling, grammar and punctuation. In Maths, we will be moving onto the topics of Angles and Shape. In Science, we will be completing our learning about plants and working scientifically. In History, we will be finding out about the Roman Empire and its impact on Britain. We will learn about Roman technology and Roman forts. This will link in with our DT, as we will look at nets and then create a 3D Roman Fort. In Geography, we will be learning key facts about earthquakes and volcanoes and their impact on the local environment. French lessons will continue this term with the children learning how to ask and/or answer simple questions and use short phrases to give information. In RE this term, we will be focusing on how faith and beliefs can help us, and others, decide what is right and wrong. In our PSHE lessons we will be exploring the topic of Emotions. In Music this term, we are continuing to focus on composition but we will be using body percussion to create a rhythm and beat. In PE, we will be playing cricket and developing our striking and fielding techniques. Finally in Computing, we will be returning to Scratch to write algorithms and programs that use a range of events to trigger sequences of actions.

Reminders...

Water bottles are brought to school on Monday and sent home on Friday. Please make sure that there is only water in your bottle.

PE kits should be in school at all times. Our PE day is Thursday and Rural Derbyshire Sports will be teaching cricket this term.

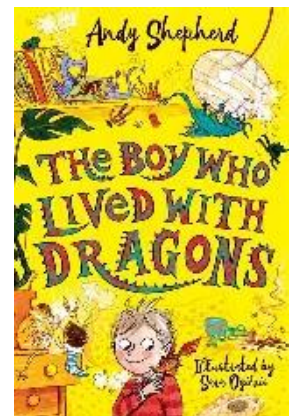
If you choose to bring in a snack, please ensure it is fruit or vegetables. No nuts please 😊

Homework will be given out each week on a Wednesday and should be returned the following Wednesday. We will mark it together in class. There will also be the Maths Whizz homework each week. Children can also use TT-Rockstars to practise their times tables.

Please use the home-school planner to record each time you listen to your child read at home. Ideally this should be 3 times a week to increase reading fluency, expression and comprehension. Listening to you read stories too is a great way to increase understanding of vocabulary, use of expression and general understanding of a text. Reading books and planners need to go between school and home every day please.
