



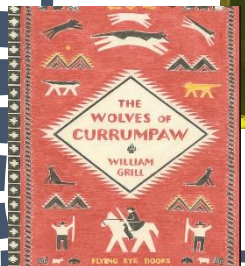
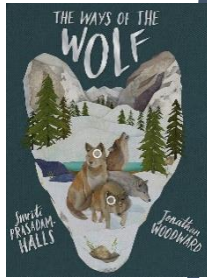
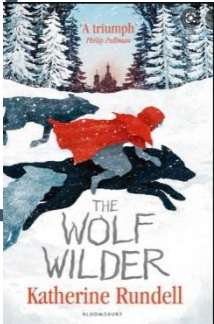

Key Learning this term...

This term Year 6 will be exploring the topic Wolves.

Our literacy lessons will be based upon the text 'Wolf Wilder'. We will use this text as a stimulus for our writing. The children will produce a variety of text types such as: non-chronological reports, newspaper articles and poetry. We will teach grammar principles daily.

In Maths we are focusing on decimals and percentages and how they link to fractions. We will consolidate our arithmetic learning through short fluency sessions. We will be working on a variety of worded problems throughout our maths sessions to ensure that children can apply their fluency knowledge.

We will explore our wolf topic through a variety of other subjects. In Geography we will explore climate and biomes focusing on the habitat of wolves, we will even create our own biome in a bottle! In Science we will explore light and carry out investigations covering Newton's theory.

Our Christian value this term is 'Generosity' we will be exploring this through out multi-faith unit and our reflection areas. In PSHE we will explore the term 'informed choice'.

We are so excited for young voices this term and we will continue to practise the songs in school. This is such a great experience and we know that the children will love it!
