



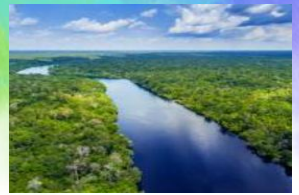

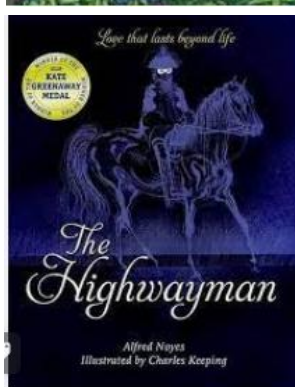
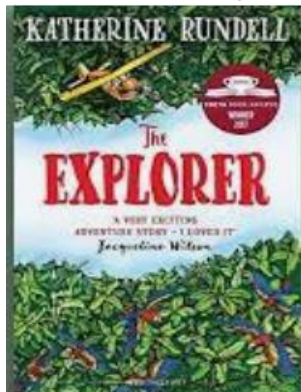

Key Learning this term...

This term, All Saints' will be reflecting on the value of **Compassion** in classrooms and in Collective worship.

Literacy: We will be writing a newspaper article and an information text. All of our work will relate to our class book: *The Explorer* by Katherine Rundell. We will also be studying *The Highwayman* by Alfred Noyes for this term's poetry focus.

Maths: As well as having a quick look at Roman numerals, We will focus on Place value, addition and subtraction.

Science: Our topic is 'Forces' this term

Geography: We will be learning about world rivers and building on our knowledge on river features from Y4.

RE: Our area of focus this term is about Science and religion complementing and conflicting when we think about how the world was created.

PSHE: Difference and diversity. We will also have regular circle times in the classroom.

Art: we will look at portraits and experiment with different styles of portraits this term.

Dates for the diary...
