## Key Learning this term...

In literacy this term, we will be exploring our work around the brilliant book 'Wonder' by R.J. Palacio. We are going to focus upon spoken language in literacy and provide the children with an opportunity to present to other members of the class. In our poetry unit we are going to understand and define the features used in the 'Jabberwocky' by Lewis Carroll and we hope to create our own version of this poem. During the term, we will be continuing to provide the children with mathematical investigations to enable them to develop their explanation and reasoning skills. We are going to revisit and extend key mathematical knowledge to ensure that the children are best prepared for year 7.

We are excited to explore Cezanne landscapes in art, focusing upon adaption to enable the children to develop their own style. In RE we will be focusing upon the term 'commitment', the children have already started by thinking about what they are committed to. We will be supporting the children with their transition this term and our PSHE work will provide them with an opportunity to talk about this openly. We will explore the decades in History and build upon their chronological knowledge.

We cannot wait to perfect our school play this term and already this week we have joined together for a rehearsal and started to learn the songs! We have loved teaching your children this year and we will be enjoying every moment with them in their final term at All Saints 😊
